
Dear Operator,

Super Monaco GP

March 16, 1990

The enclosed conversion kit must be applied to your Super Monaco GP (Upright, Deluxe and Cockpit) game. There are replacement ROMs that will remove the Philip Morris (Marlboro) Name and Logo from the game video graphics and stickers for the cabinet. **The game play is not changed.**

The Serial Number of your Super Monaco GP Game should correspond with the number on the outside of this packing tube.

Replace the two ROMs (shown on the attached sheet) with the parts enclosed and apply the stickers to the cabinet.

1. Unplug the Super Monaco Game from the wall socket.
2. (U/R),(Cockpit) Remove the back door of the game and identify the Main PCB.
(Deluxe) Remove the side door, remove the metal cage. Remove the top of the cage.
3. Identify the two ROMs to be replaced (see the attached sheet).
4. Carefully remove the old parts from the main board. Support the board under this area and install the new parts, making sure the part numbers are correct and polarity, (the notch), is facing the correct direction.
5. Check to make sure there are no bent pins and the ROMs are fully seated in the sockets.
6. Reassemble the game.
7. Apply the decals as shown on the diagram, on the label sheet.
